



Accuplacer Next Generation

As of March 2020, the PERT test is no longer being administered as the admissions exam at Broward College Ecuador. It has been replaced by the Accuplacer Next Generation exam suite, offered by College Board. This exam has some structural similarities to the PERT, but the scoring and placement system is different:

MATHEMATICS (Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics)

Score	Math Course
≤258	MAC1105C - College Algebra and Remedial Math Combined*
259 – 300	MAC1105 College Algebra**

* Any scores below 259 will be analyzed on a case by case scenario for proper placement.

**Please Note: To determine placement higher than MAC1105 departmental testing is needed.

READING:

Score	Reading Course
≤244	LOEP needed
245 - 300	ENC1101- Composition I

WRITING:

Score	Writing Course
≤244	LOEP needed
245 - 300	ENC1101- Composition I

PERT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How many questions will comprise the Accuplacer Next Generation?

A: Each sub-section (Reading, Writing and Mathematics) will be 20 multiple choice questions.

Q: How long will the Accuplacer take to complete?

A: It is estimated that students will take 45 - 60 minutes to complete each sub-section, but there is no time limit.

Q: Are students allowed to re-take the Accuplacer immediately after the first attempt?

A: No, students should spend time reflecting on their test results and preparing for the re-take. There are also many Accuplacer practice web pages and resources that students should use before taking the exam.

EXAM PREPARATION COURSE

There is a mandatory Accuplacer Preparation course that ALL new applicants must complete before they are permitted to take the admissions exam. This course will cover the format, content, and strategies for completing the Accuplacer Reading and Writing sections.

Level of English Proficiency (LOEP).

In case the applicant does not meet the minimum scores required for Composition I (245 on both Reading and Writing), the student will need to take the Level of English Proficiency (LOEP) test.

What is the purpose of this test? If Accuplacer scores do not indicate college readiness, it does not mean the end of your college journey. Instead you will need to go through 1 or 2 terms of English preparation (English for Academic Purposes) classes before you are ready for ENC1101 (Composition I). The purpose of the LOEP is to determine your level of English, and how much preparation you will need in order to succeed at the college level.

Scores will be analyzed for each student, and placement will be determined by the English Coordinator. A secondary preparation session will be organized and practice resources will be provided.

COVID-19 NOTICE

Due to social distancing measures in place during the pandemic, for the Fall Semester of 2020 all admissions exams are being administered online using the external Examity online proctoring service. Upon completing their registration, new applicants will receive instructions from the Registrar and Admissions Coordinator regarding the registration for the Examity service, and guidelines for the online testing procedure.

The Accuplacer Preparation course will be delivered online using Zoom. Applicants will be advised of dates and times upon completion of their registration.
